## A Management Plan for Floodplain Buyouts in Jefferson County

## Thursday, August 31, 2017

The Jefferson County Park's Department is responsible for managing the County's over 120 floodplain buyout properties. In an effort to identify additional, publically-supported uses for the sites and to be more transparent and consistent about their management, the Department is partnering with the Environmental Law Institute (eli.org) and the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill to develop a floodplain buyout management plan.
