Port & Tanker Safety Act, 1978 Argo Merchant, Nantucket, December 1976

Oil Pollution Act, 1990 Exxon Valdez, March 1989

Renewed focus on offshore drilling, not transportation

Largest spill ever; great depth of release

May be largest commercial fishery loss from spill in US history

US share of offshore drilling market much less than for oil transport
