Adena Rissman focuses on people-environment relations as an associate professor of the human dimensions of ecosystem management in the Department of Forest and Wildlife Ecology at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Her research focuses on conservation policy design and implementation, the ecological impacts of conservation policy, and social and legal adaptation to environmental change. She has extensive expertise researching conservation easements. She has published 40 peer-reviewed articles, including 17 on conservation easements, since 2007. She has presented at the Land Trust Alliance (LTA) Rally six times, conducted webinars and in-person trainings with the Midwest and Southeast LTA regions, and published in the LTA magazine Saving Land. She formerly worked for the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources as a forest planner. She earned her B.A. at the University of Texas at Austin and her Ph.D. at the University of California, Berkeley.
