Why did LCSA happen?



- "Over 80,000 chemicals in commerce, many untested"
- Lack of Confidence
- Significant retailer and state activity

Implementation of LCSA



- Framework rules
 - Inventory Active/Inactive Rule
 - Prioritization Rule
 - Risk Evaluation Rule
 - Fees Rule
- New Chemicals
 - Assertive Finding
 - Transparency Efforts
 - Alternatives to Animal Testing
- Ongoing Section 6 Rule makings
 - Methylene Chloride Ban on Paint and Coating Removal for Consumer Use
- First 10 chemicals
 - All Problem Formulations released on time
 - Pigment Violet 29 first draft risk evaluation
 - Nine more before December
- Science Advisory Committee on Chemicals (SACC)

Has LCSA Restored Confidence?



- Around 40,000 chemicals currently in commerce, 10 under risk evaluation
- Some areas of improvement
- Other areas unclear (or not yet?)
- Pace of retailer and state activity has not slowed
