

Jimmie Powell is the currently the senior policy advisory for energy at The Nature Conservancy and works in the Arlington, Virginia office. He first joined the Conservancy as the director of U.S. government relations in 2004.

Mr. Powell served in several capacities during a twenty-year career with the United States Senate concluding as the staff director of the Senate Committee on Environment and Public Works (EPW) where he worked for its Chairman, Senator John H. Chafee. He served on the staff of the Committee for a total of 15 years working principally on the Clean Air Act, the Clean Water Act, the Endangered Species Act and the Safe Drinking Water Act. He began his career with the Senate in 1979 as the legislative assistant for energy policy to Senator Dave Durenberger and served as his legislative director and as the staff director of the Senate Subcommittee on Intergovernmental Relations before joining the staff of EPW.

After leaving the Senate, Mr. Powell served for two years as the executive director of the Pew Oceans Commission co-chaired by Governor Christie Whitman (R-NJ) and former Congressman Leon Panetta (D-CA). He has been a board member for the League of Conservation Voters and the Council on Sustainable Biomass Production and was a member of the DOE Biomass Research and Development Technical Advisory Committee.
