
Support and Coordination

- Representing the organization and acting in its best interest
- Where are the holes?
 - Scientific expertise
 - Legal expertise
 - Public Interest
- What is the community hoping to achieve?

Representation

- Traditional attorney-client relationship
- Likely to be representing individuals who have the same goals as the organization

Environmental Justice Roadmap



1

Avoid pre-determination

2

Allow community members and potential partners to introduce the issue before presenting preferred alternative 3

Be explicit about the goals of the conversation and next steps (i.e. what to expect from continued engagement)

Identifying Issues

Communicating with Partners

- Listen first
- Consistency in message
- Thoughtful assessment of the situation



Working Towards A Solution



Prepare for the long-term (i.e. point of contact, potential partners, timeline for involvement)



Be flexible in identifying a solution and determining roles



Plan an exit strategy



Friends of Buckingham v. State Air Pollution Control Board (2020)





Outcome

On Appeal, the Fourth Circuit ruled in favor of the Friends of Buckingham and CBF

- Holdings
- The Board failed to make any findings regarding the character of the local population
- The Board failed to individually consider the potential degree of injury to the local population independent of National Ambient Air Quality Standards and state emission standards
- The Board's adoption and reliance "on evidence in the record that was incomplete or discounted by subsequent evidence
- Permit vacated and remanded to the Board for reconsideration

In Summer of 2020, Dominion announced that it was canceling the Atlantic Coast Pipeline project.
